

The Deep State's Battle Against Rev. Moon

... This internal dispensational history that I speak of all took place before 1947; my public ministry began after that year. The 7-year period from 1947 to 1954, the year that the Unification Church was formally established, was the period in which I set physical conditions. The first place I went was North Korea. That 7-year period was truly an incredible time. Having spiritually recovered the qualification for lordship before 1947 I had to set the condition of physical suffering in order to launch my own ministry, as well as the organization that came about in 1954. Those 7 years were a time of incredible suffering...

*God's Preparation for Our Church, and Its Early Days
Rev. Sun Myung Moon, May 1, 1977, Tarrytown, New York*



Rev. Moon was born in 1920 in what is now North Korea. At the age of 15 on Easter Sunday morning, he was deep in prayer on a mountainside near his home, when Jesus appeared before him and asked him to complete what Jesus had left unfulfilled.

From that age Rev. Moon totally dedicated his life to solve the problems of human suffering. His spiritual senses opened up and he was able to travel freely throughout the spirit world and search for answers in dialogue with the historic figures of God's providence, and in direct dialogue with God Himself. He also experienced numerous life and death battles with demonic forces.

He traveled to Japan to study electrical engineering. While there he joined the underground working for Korean liberation from Japanese occupation. He was arrested multiple times both in Japan and in Korea, and was very severely tortured, but never gave up any information on other members of the organization.

When Korea was freed from Japanese occupation, Rev. Moon actively sought out the Japanese police who had tortured him, and helped them escape to Japan. He said later that this love he showed to his enemies set the foundation for Japan to work with Korea in the future.

After WWII he travelled to Communist North Korea to work as an evangelist in its capital, Pyongyang, which was referred to as “the Jerusalem of the East” because of the fervency and spirituality of the Christian groups there. His ministry grew very quickly and was known as the “Crying Church” for the deep and tearful prayers that members experienced. But other well-established churches resented losing their members to this young new evangelist, and they made false accusations to the Communist authorities there.

Rev. Moon was arrested and tortured to the point of death, and left on a pile of dead bodies. His disciples were guided to him and brought him back to their center and nursed him back to health over many weeks. Once he was finally strong enough, he rose and began preaching again. In 1948, he was arrested in Pyongyang a second time, but this time he was sent to the HeungNam hard labor camp. Life expectancy at HeungNam was 6 months. Rev. Moon was in that death camp under the most unimaginable conditions for nearly three full years. Still during that time, he was able to gain 12 disciples while at that prison.

In 1950 the United Nations invaded Korea. McArthur felt great urgency to recapture Seoul. He landed at Inchon on September 15th, 1950, and demanded that his commanders liberate Seoul within 10 days - by September 25th. Allied forces under the command of Alexander Haig liberated HeungNam prison camp on October 14th, just 19 days later. They arrived at HeungNam only hours before Rev. Moon was scheduled to have been executed.

Rev. Moon spent 40 days in Pyongyang looking for his scattered disciples and only then returned to South Korea.

Rev. Moon founded the Holy Spirit Association For The Unification Of World Christianity in 1954. Although he never intended to create his own church, the organization became known as “the Unification Church”.

Rev. Moon succeeded in laying the substantial global foundation for the Victory over Communism on June 7, 1975.

In 1975, a most important dispensational victory was won in Korea. After the Day of Hope banquet at the Chosun Hotel I went to every major city throughout the Republic of Korea, declaring God's message to tens of thousands of people. It was the most historical evangelical crusade that ever took place in Korea. It was climaxed by the Korean Rally for World Freedom on June 7, on Yoido Island, which was attended by 1.2 million people. At that rally I publicly declared that communism is the enemy of mankind and the enemy of God.



By attracting world attention and gathering the representatives of 60 nations, the June 7 rally accomplished a physical victory on the worldwide level. On the foundation of all our successes I could expand that substantial victory, and so I returned again to America, this time with a different, heightened mission. My previous mission in America had been on a spiritual level, but in 1975 I came back to America to fulfill a physical mission.

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May 1, 1977, Tarrytown, New York

At this same time, between 1947 and 1975, within the US Government, America's foundation and authority to confront Communism was gradually diminishing.

During this period, centering on the House Un-American Activities Committee, the battle against communism, the future leadership of America, and the providential work of the Unification Church in the global battle against Communism were all interwoven.

The Standing committee of the House Un-American Activities existed in Congress from 1945 – 1975.

The Fish Committee, which was a precursor to the House Un-American Activities Committee was established in 1930, by Hamilton Fish. His granddaughter became the US president of the Women's Federation for World Peace, launched by Rev. & Mrs. Moon.

In 1947, the House Un-American Activities Committee launched hearings on the influence of communism in Hollywood. The first two witnesses were Ronald Reagan & Walt Disney. The pushback against these hearings laid the foundation for the monolithic Hollywood backlash against the right.

In (1948 - 50) the House Un-American Activities Committee held the hearings against two Russian spies: Whittaker Chambers and Alger Hiss respectively. Freshman Congressman Richard Nixon was central in exposing Hiss.

In 1950, In the Senate, Joseph McCarthy launched the infamous McCarthy Hearings, which continued until he was censured by the senate in 1954. In the wake of the downfall of Senator McCarthy, the prestige of the House Un-American Activities Committee began a gradual decline.

In (1960) the much weaker HH-AAC held hearings in San Francisco that spawned the Free Speech movement and radicalization of college campuses, especially in California. The committee lost considerable prestige as the 1960s progressed, increasingly becoming the target of political satirists and the defiance of a new generation of political activists.

In (1969) the HU-ACC was renamed as the House Internal Security Committee, Chaired by Richard Ichord, who later worked closely with the Unification Church heading up the American Freedom Coalition.

The committee was terminated on January 14, 1975, just a few months before Rev. Moon's Yoido Island victory.

He then came back to the US to launch rallies at Madison Square Gardens, Yankee Stadium, Washington Monument.

The first 3 years of the third 7-year course were 1975, 1976, and 1977. You are the eyewitnesses of the Yankee Stadium and Washington Monument campaigns, which culminated in physical victory on a worldwide scale.

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In 1973, when Richard Nixon was attacked by the entire government, Rev. Moon prayed and asked God how America should respond.


The answer he received was: Forgive, Love, and Unite.

He was one of the very few public figures standing up and defending Nixon against the deep state.

Here's a statement placed in the New York Times on Nov. 30, 1973.



Unfortunately he was unsuccessful. What resulted were the Watergate hearings which horribly divided our country. Nixon was forced to resign in 1974.



After the success of the Washington Monument campaign, Rev. Moon was attacked by the left leaning Congressman Donald Fraser, Chairman of the House International Organizations Subcommittee.

His investigation and hearings lasted from 1977 through 1978, but proved no wrongdoing. Interestingly, the Fraser committee tapped investigators from the Watergate hearings, and it was accused of hiring a virtually totally one-sided, team of investigators.

The tax prosecution of Rev. Moon followed directly after the failed Fraser hearings.

On July 20, 1984 after extended legal battles, Rev. Moon was imprisoned for more than a year.

A [Senate](#) subcommittee, chaired by Senator [Orrin Hatch](#), conducted its own investigation into Reverend Moon's tax case and published its findings in a report which concluded:

I do feel strongly, after my subcommittee has carefully and objectively reviewed this case from both sides, that injustice rather than justice has been served. The Moon case sends a strong signal that if one's views are unpopular enough, this country will find a way not to tolerate, but to convict. I don't believe that you or I or anyone else, no matter how innocent, could realistically prevail against the combined forces of our Justice Department and judicial branch in a case such as Reverend Moon's.

While in prison, Rev. Moon started the Washington Times, as a conservative voice to counter-balance the Washington Post.

Rev. Moon started many organizations from universities and seminaries, ballet academies, ecumenical organizations, service organizations, and most significantly organizations to strengthen families. He pioneered inter-religious and inter-national marriages as a way to harmonize enemies through inter-generational reconciliation. His mass weddings centered on the Marriage Blessing, have been held in virtually all countries around the world. He taught that such weddings were the foundation for reconciling mankind back to God's lineage.

In 2016, Donald Trump was elected President to almost everyone's total surprise.

Trump's political mentor was Roy Cohn, who was Joe McCarthy's assistant and staunchly anti-communist.

Rev. Moon's wife, Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon has continued his work since his passing in 2012. She has been working with heads of state and top religious leaders around the world to strengthen families and build foundations for peace. In 2019 she launched the World Christian Leadership Conference.

That same year she conducted a remarkable worldwide tour with national level marriage blessings as the centerpiece. In numerous nations those events were organized with the support and participation of the heads of state in those nations. In Niger, she held a continental summit with official representatives from every nation in Africa. Two weeks later she presided over a Blessing festival in South Africa for 200,000 participants, and another 3 million who watched on TV. Here is a video about that event.


